City diplomacy and economic development

Economic development is a key motivation for many cities to engage internationally. Cities seek to build partnerships to encourage foreign investment, promote trade and tourism and strengthen their international 'brand'. This module aims to enhance metropolitan officers' understanding of the ways in which cities are working with a diverse range of international actors in order to achieve these objectives, such as philanthropies, multilateral lending agencies and multinational corporations. It also looks at the way in which international economic development strategies can link local and multi-level urban planning strategy cycles.

Measuring results and impact

Metropolitan authorities operate in a context of limited resources and need to justify how their activities are benefitting their citizens. Defending the expenditure on international engagement can be a significant challenge for cities if the activities cannot be linked to obvious local benefits. As well as clearly defining international strategies and objectives, more metropolitan governments are exploring how they measure the impacts of these engagements and how they align with other organizational KPIs. This session will draw on the expertise of professionals with experience in devising, delivering and assessing the impact of an international urban strategy with a focus on sharing models of outcome measurement.

Tuesday 19 November



The C40 World Mayors Summit recognises the Barcelona Superblock model as a successful project for transforming the city and an international example. Global capitals such as Berlin, Vienna, Rotterdam, Bogotá and Los Angeles have already adapted and applied the model, which in the last two years has attracted the interest of over 250 cities and countries, seeking detailed information on the Barcelona Superblock model from technical services at the City Council. The visit will be structured around a presentation by a civil servant of Barcelona City Council of the concept of superblock as well its impact on the city and citizenship. Afterwards we will have a walk around the Poblenou neighborhood where you will be able to experience the Poblenou neighborhood in the first person.

To attend the visit, a bus will pick us up at CEI International Affairs at 14.30h and will take us back around 17h, making 2 different stops: one in Plaza Cataluña (city center) and another one near the Sarrià Ferrocarril stop.

** Networking event at the Three Chimneys

Wednesday 20 November



From September 8th to November 24th, 2024, Manifesta, the European Nomadic Biennial, will take place in the metropolitan region of Barcelona for its 15th edition. This event aims to decentralize the cultural infrastructure of Barcelona and its neighboring cities through artistic interventions in significant historical sites and industrial locations that have never been open to the public before. On this day, we will enjoy a one-hour visit to the Three Chimneys, a striking feature of Barcelona's coastal scenery. Constructed in the 1970s and situated on the left bank of the Besòs River, these chimneys functioned as a thermal power station until their closure in 2011 and remain unused today. They stand as a tribute to those who built them and symbolize the region's recent industrial history. Following the visit, we will host a networking event featuring finger foods and soft drinks, with several key stakeholders involved in the internationalization of Barcelona's territory in attendance.

A bus will depart from Plaza Cataluña at 5:00 PM to take us to the Three Chimneys, returning around 8:30 PM with two stops: one at Plaza Cataluña (city center) and another near the Sarrià Ferrocarril stop.
